FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Student Financial Support Fund

To make life a little easier we have a robust range of financial support for eligible students. Those in priority groups can receive a bursary of up to £1,200 per year.

Daily Meal Allowance

If you have a household income which fits the threshold or received free school meals in secondary school, daily meal allowances may apply to you. If eligible, we will credit a daily meal allowance to your student card.

Discretionary Financial Support Award

This support is open to students who live in a household with an income below £36,000 (including most benefits). If you are eligible, you can choose between a travel pass to use on our buses (if you live more than one mile from the College) or a daily meal allowance. Additionally, this award also supports the cost of trips and necessary resources while studying at Franklin. Step into the fascinating world of modern history and explore the importance of civil rights, democracy for the working classes, and the impact of dictatorships and their tyranny on ordinary people. Make sense of the present by exploring the past and earn a versatile and highly regarded qualification.

What will I learn?

As an A Level History student, you will investigate the complexities of Communist Russia (1917 to 1991) and the People's Republic of China (1949 to 1976), and explore British history with a key focus on protest, agitation, and reform from 1780 to 1928, while coursework will focus on the abolition of the slave trade in Britain. You'll also have the opportunity to take part in incredible overseas trips to Athens or Rome, as well as get to know British history better with a visit to the Pankhurst Centre in Manchester. As part of your studies, you'll also experience universitystyle learning through lectures, seminars, and workshops at the University of Hull's acclaimed Wilberforce Institute for the Study of Slavery and Emancipation.

Sharpen your critical thinking skills as you explore multiple perspectives in complex arguments while nurturing a comprehensive understanding of the British and global political systems. This is a fascinating course where genuine free speech and evidencebased views are always welcomed and encouraged.

What will I learn?

Studying A Level Politics will give you an understanding of British politics, exploring pressure groups, devolution, voting systems, and much more. Go further and discover the forces of globalisation and the role of influential bodies such as the UN, NATO, and the IMF. You'll get to grips with a variety of differing ideologies, from anarchism to conservatism and everything in between. As well as hearing from inspiring guest speakers and getting stuck into lively debates, you'll take your studies beyond the classroom with visits to the University of Hull, Parliament, and the Supreme Court in London.

If you want to experience the world around you and develop a critical understanding of people, places, and environments, A Level Geography is the perfect course for you. You'll discover how and why things happen and gain a deeper understanding of our world today.

What will I learn?

This course combines physical and human geography to understand what makes things happen across the UK and on a global scale. You'll explore fascinating topics such as tectonic plates and coasts, globalisation and regeneration, water and carbon cycles, superpowers, migration, and identity. Throughout your studies, you'll also develop your research skills and during your second year have the chance to complete an independent investigation in an area that interests you. Beyond the classroom, you'll have the chance to take part in a range of exciting trips, visits, and experiences in the field.

Throughout the course, you'll develop personal thematic projects and have plenty of opportunities to showcase your work. 


