5. Our 'ABC' expectations

All students have signed our ABC (Attend, Behave, Commit) expectations. We treat this as our 'contract of employment' to enable students to understand their responsibilities going into adult life. We've learned – even more clearly through and beyond Covid – that the impact of poor attendance can be catastrophic for students' grades and harmful to their progress through and beyond College. This is why we expect full attendance from students and do not authorise any holiday absences. All absences must be reported by 8.30am.

6. The Bridge, Independent Study, Skills Development, and preparation for Reading Week

We invested £2 million last year, developing our learning and social spaces, refitting our Wi-Fi, and upgrading the canteen, coffee shop, and several rooms / areas.

We're very proud of our new learning space, The Bridge. Students now have access to a university-style learning environment, which includes drop-in support space, open access IT, and independent study spaces.



This development supports young people in beginning to build their skills and their maturity, resilience, and independence so they can progress towards a positive future. We expect all students to undertake skills development as an integral part of their Study Programme and include a university-style 'Reading Week' in late October to help embed progress. Teachers and Progress Coaches will support and set work so students can make the most of their College experience.

7. A reminder about available financial support

We don't want finances to get in the way of the best possible education, and we know circumstances can change. The threshold for financial support is now any household with an income of less than £36,000. If you need more information about what's available, please get in touch.

8. An update for second years on university applications

The internal UCAS deadline for applicants for Oxbridge & MDV (Medicine, Dentistry, and Veterinary) programmes is 22nd September 2023. All other UCAS applications have an internal deadline of 27th November 2023.

Please direct your child to their Progress Coach who will guide and support them during the process. Attendance at Aspire is a compulsory part of a student's Study Programme to develop personal and professional skills ready for their progression.

9. Parent Governor vacancy

We currently have a vacancy for a parent (the term "parent" includes natural parent, adoptive parent, legal guardian, and stepparent) interested in joining our Governing Body and helping to transform lives through learning.
