THE COLLEGE

At North East Lincolnshire's only sixth form college, we take great pride in the reputation we've established as specialists in 16-19 education. Our aim is to enable every student to achieve more than they thought possible, earning us a reputation as a high performing sixth form college.

Franklin Sixth Form College is the region's only Ofsted Outstanding provider of sixth form education. Since our founding in 1990, we've been proud of the exceptional education we offer young people from across our area, serving our communities of North, Central and Coastal Lincolnshire; we're excited about our role in promoting life chances and social mobility in these communities. Our dedicated teachers and cross-college staff work tirelessly to positively impact our students' lives.

The profile of our student body is distinct from that of many other Sixth Form Colleges; with levels of disadvantage considerably high in the area. It is exceptional therefore to say that each year, our students successfully gain places on prestigious courses at universities across the country, as well as competitive apprenticeships, employment, and further training.

We are proud to offer the widest range of academic and vocational courses available in the region at Level 2 including GCSE maths and English, Level 3, Vocational, A Level and T Level courses, and a community adult provision offering a range of programmes, including ESOL.

With a very strong vision and set of values and a profound passion for providing young people with fantastic education, industry specialists, personal development opportunities, and amazing memories, the students in our community grow and develop, making their way and changing their world. Our students are more likely to gain good university degrees, and more likely to be successful in securing employment than other sixth form college students.

This is testament to the work of our specialist teachers and cross college staff, and to all of our fantastic students and their families.



We are setting our plans in the middle of the largest growth phase in the history of the college, while celebrating the first recognition that Franklin Sixth Form College is the only OUTSTANDING Sixth Form College in the county.

We continue to embrace the many challenges and opportunities this presents, responding with energy and enthusiasm while supporting each and every student in their education journey, ensuring at all times that Franklin is an inclusive college, serving its community.

The plan also takes into account other current developments within the local and national education context, including:

- The reducing number of Designated Sixth Form Colleges, and the shrinking
 of our sector as a result of the increasing number of academies. This, plus
 the wide opportunities of alternative designated MAT status, will serve the
 College well in the promotion of great collaboration and partnership
 working.
- A significant gap in qualification and skills levels in the local area at the same time the demand for high quality education places increases, significant investment in work sectors and new homes, and a higher number of Level 3 professions continues to grow.

- Franklin's receipt of the highest Ofsted grade of Outstanding, awarded in May 2024, solidifying it's place and purpose in the local community, and a continued focus to work in partnership and collaboration with other local education providers, universities and employers.
- Significant proposed curriculum and qualification reforms, particularly for vocational and technical education, which have the potential to both threaten and create opportunity for our core study programme offer.
- A greater need to focus on supporting our students to grow and achieve, and supporting staff to realise their own potential and expertise.
- A campus that has grown through significant investment in order to meet the demand for students places, but that is recognised as having a maximum capacity, directing significant effort into working with other post-16 providers to ensure all students can access the high quality of education.
- A more diverse adult student population, with more students accessing our Adult Learning Hub from a wide range of different countries, placing a greater demand on ESOL courses and other courses that provide access to better jobs and break down barriers to work.




An inclusive sixth form college serving its community and local businesses

We will prioritise securing high levels of academic success for all students so that they have significantly greater choices in the next stage of their lives, regardless of their prior experience or academic achievement.

To achieve this, we will:

- 1. Continually review our curriculum offer and entry thresholds to ensure our inclusive intent is maintained and we recruit students with integrity.
- 2. Maintain a diverse programme offer, including Level 2, Level 3, and adult provision, reflecting the skills needs of the local, regional and national stages, and importantly, student aspirations.
- 3. Plan resources appropriately to meet the increasing student population, prioritising collaboration and partnership working to support all education providers and students in the area.
- 4. Support our Adult and Community provision, focussing primarily on supporting literacy and numeracy development and adult retraining and workforce preparation.
- 5. Continue to develop our approach to Personal and Professional **Development through our Centre for Professional Development,** continuously engaging with key stakeholders such as employers, universities, schools, DfE, devolved Lincolnshire authorities and adhering to our Local Skills Improvement Plan.






To achieve this, we will:

- 5. Achieve qualification pass rates above the national average.


