## REVISION SUPPORT

### UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS

Please note that applications for students who want to apply for 2026 entry opens in May. Progress Coaches will support students in creating a UCAS account and provide guidance on writing their personal statement. Students will complete a first draft of their personal statement before they leave for the summer term. Please encourage your child to be proactive in their progression research. All students can access Unifrog, which contains know-how guides, online courses, apprenticeship guides, university comparisons, CV-building tools, etc. This personal statement can also be adapted to be used as a supporting statement for employment.

#### **Early Applications**

For those applying for Medicine, Dentistry, Vet Med/Sci, Oxford, Cambridge, all applications have to be sent to UCAS by October 15th, 2025, at 6pm. Therefore, the internal deadline for completing UCAS forms for these students will be September 17th. All students applying for early applicant courses will be invited to an early applicant meeting in the near future. https://www.ucas.com/

#### **Apprenticeships/Employment**

Your child will be supported through ASPIRE sessions and 1:1 meetings, whichever route they choose after college.
