(Please note you will not be able to edit this document so please either use the document as a guide for your handwritten notes or print it out and write directly onto the document).5. Now go back to the tab 'course' and work through the 5 units making sure that you make your notes along the way.6. Once you have completed the course you will then complete a 500 word summary that is handwritten which concludes what you have learnt from the introductory course. The use of AI is not permitted.
