A Level

(AQA) – Split into 2 components.

Component 1- Personal Investigation/Written Essay (60%).

Component 2- Exam (40%) - 15 Hours practical exam. Graded A-E.

Both courses cover essential photographic skills, along with an opportunity to develop your own photographic work by completing personal briefs and pursuing your own photographic style.
