

Virtual Biomedical Science Taster Lecture with University of London

This virtual event will give you the opportunity to experience two mini taster lectures, each 20 minutes long, delivered by academics from their Biomedical Science BSc degree.

The first taster lecture will be delivered by Senior Lecturer Dr David Gillott and will provide an overview of the structure of the heart and explain the basic cardiac functions. The systemic and pulmonary circulation are outlined along with electrical conduction through the heart, the ECG and heart sounds. There will be an opportunity for attendees to interact during the event, when they open the floor for questions via the Q&A function.


Leeds Futures Programme with the University of Leeds

LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION



What is LMI?

Labour Market Information (LMI) is information that provides insight into the labour markets at different levels (local, regionally or nationally). LMI looks at the industries that are growing and declining and the types and levels of jobs that are increasing and decreasing. LMI is useful to help research future jobs in the local area, understanding the skills needed for certain roles and the demand for future employment.

Each week, we'll be focusing on a different industry and exploring the LMI for that industry.

Engineering Labour Market Information

Engineering is the application of scientific, social, and practical knowledge in order to invent, design, build, maintain, research, and improve structures, machines, devices, systems, materials, and processes.

The discipline of engineering is extremely broad and encompasses a range of more specialised fields of engineering, each with a more specific emphasis on particular areas of applied science, technology and types

What opportunities are available?

- There is an annual shortfall of up to 59,000 engineering graduates and technicians to fill core engineering roles nationally.
 - New industries and technologies are emerging, adding to already significant demand for engineering skills.
 - 203,000 people with Level 3+ engineering skills are needed every year to meet demand.
 - Employment trends for the Humber show that this is an increasing sector for employment.

Did you know?

- There are more than 7,500 people employed in this sector in the Humber.
 - This accounts for 2% of employment in the region.
 - Nationally, only 11% of the Engineering workforce is female.
- Engineers can work in many different industries, such as chemicals, food manufacturing, the motor and aerospace industries.
 - Engineers use computers and new technologies to design products.
