



Access to Sheffield - applications open today

The University of Sheffield runs the Access to Sheffield programme for Year 12 and 13 students, designed to give a real taste of university life and help with decisions about higher education. There are five subject pathways to choose from—Arts & Humanities, STEM, Medicine, Dentistry, and Law—each including workshops, campus visits, summer schools, and guidance with UCAS applications. All participants benefit from skills-building activities, optional mentoring from current undergraduates, and free access to online study resources. The programme is aimed at students who meet widening participation criteria (such as being the first in their family to attend university, receiving free school meals, or having experience of care) and who are on track to meet the academic requirements for their chosen pathway. Completing the programme can also lead to a reduced ("contextual") offer for a place at the University of Sheffield.
