Summer Examinations Period

Examinations run through this half term right up until Wednesday 28 June and include GCSEs, A' levels and a number of vocational course examination sittings.

It's important to note that the **Exam Boards have asked us to clarify that all candidates for exams need to remain available** until Wednesday 28 June should any examination need to be rescheduled for any reason.

Students have been asked to complete exam readiness work and double-check the days and times of their examinations on their student portal. We also ask all students to be supportive of each other, for example by keeping the noise down around the campus, especially around examination rooms. It is quite natural that students taking exams are a little more anxious, and it is great to see that the wide range of wellbeing and exam prep sessions that have been put in place have been really well attended.

Classes and a range of support activity will continue, and we expect our leaving students to be in subject classes until their examinations in that subject are completed.

Reflecting on the Year – Progress Point 6 (PI6) Assessments and Reviews

For students planning on returning to College for the next academic year, a year-end reflection and review is taking place. Students will be guided through a personal consideration of their progress, along with the attendance and effort grades. In discussions with their teachers, they'll be able to plan for making next year even better!

For our Level 2 students looking to progress in College next year, the reflections are extended with a bridging programme of activities to help the transition move smoothly. Changes to our Financial Support thresholds

Students have been made aware of important changes we are making to our financial support system to reflect the rising costs of living. The total household income threshold has been raised from £28,000 to £36,000. Any family who has less than £36,000 total household income can apply to the fund; applications are open throughout the year so please consider if you may now be eligible to receive support and contact the Finance Team in College if you wish to either check or apply.
